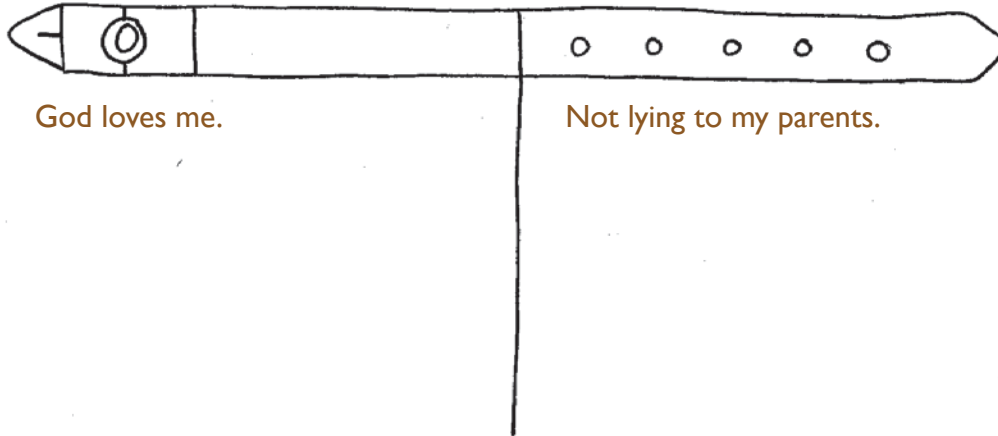
Belt of truth

BOOTCAMP
