Welcome to the "Chor Police" Vacation Bible School!"

Are you ready to put on your police hat and running shoes for some real chor chasing fun? You guessed it! It's time to decorate your church with a castle theme, put some police badges or stars on the walls, and turn up the speakers with chasing music.

This vacation Bible school has an evangelistic focus. Your students will learn stories from the life of Jesus Christ each day in an exciting way with homemade clay. Over the week they will discover God's ultimate plan for salvation with five key Bible verses from the book of Romans (known in some countries and denominations as the "Roman's Road.")

The students will learn that God sees everyone and knows all the bad things people think, say, or do. Sin separates people from God and requires punishment. Jesus chose to be punished for all the bad things people do. His finished sacrifice is optional and requires a choice from people to take it or not. You can lead students to ask Jesus to forgive them and thank Him for taking the punishment they deserve and promise to follow God the rest of their lives. You can encourage your students to become messengers of the good news they learned at VBS to everyone they know. Each lesson is supported with a super-fun drama/skit that will kick-off each day of your Vacation Bible School with laughter. Your actors in their costumes can be great helpers everywhere in your VBS to build relationships with your students. Seeing them moving from area to area will help

your students remember the message of the day.

Decoration will be easy a jail, police car, and castle. You can make decorating even easier by picking up your own castle scenery backdrop for your church's stage. (Or of course, you can download it off our website and have it printed in your city!) For extra fun, don't forget to set up a bakery where everyone from your church can pick up some candy or even lunch after your. Vacation Bible School

The kids will be challenged to think of themselves as the people in the Bible story and voting on what they would choose to do. They will enjoy working through puzzles in their handouts, reviewing the bible story with clay, and learning the memory verse with a fun game. From there, they head over to Crafts where they will get sticky making a new craft to take home each day. The game time will also be a favorite because children always love competition. Each team will be easy to spot with their brightly colored bandanas or ribbons. No one will forget to stop by the snack table for some juicy and delicious snacks.

Take this opportunity to evangelize because people need to hear the gospel! How can they if someone doesn't put on a Vacation Bible School? "And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?" Romans 10:14b

How to Use this Material

How to Invite

Many churches really get excited as they start inviting the community to their Vacation Bible School. One idea is to have a parade down a main street with all your teachers dressed up as chors or police passing out invitations, or giving away candy. Some churches even make up different floats (decorated vehicles) to drive in the parade! The most obvious way to invite is to put up posters around the community at local grocery stores or in the metro, inviting people to your Vacation Bible School. You can also stand in public areas and hand out flyers.

For the purpose of inviting, we have created a full-color invitation poster (11 x 17 inches), a two-color invitation poster (11 x 17 inches), and small flyers (5.5 x 8.5 inches). These are available to download from our website and print.

Don't forget to include an invitation campaign for your own church body, letting everyone know that a special program is coming soon. You could also hand out five flyers to each family in your church and ask them to invite their neighbors to the Vacation Bible School. The main logo, artwork, and clipart are available on the website for you to make other invitation tools like postcards, invitation banners, printed T-shirts, or door hangers. Go all out! Kids need to hear the good news, and your Vacation Bible School is a perfect place for that to happen.



Getting Volunteers

We recommend you recruit volunteers specifically for each job you will need for your Vacation Bible School. For example, you will be needing three actors who are willing to not only act silly on stage every week, but are also willing to wander around your Vacation Bible School and hug children all day long. This requires a different set of skills than the person you will recruit to run your snack station.

Start running promotion for your VBS months in advance, making the whole church excited about the upcoming program. However, when it comes to actually recruiting each person, we recommend you list out the jobs you need and think of people you know that would be good for each job. Then approach each person with a specific job opportunity. One idea is to have them sign up on a list that has all the jobs, letting others see who has signed up to help. You could also start with men who you know will say, "Yes," so that men can see that there will be other men participating, and will be encouraged to get involved. Choose people based on their gifts and skills in any given department.

Some people may not be accustomed to helping in children's ministry, but when you approach them about a specific job, they are willing to sign up. Participating in a Vacation Bible School is a great way to show people in your church how much fun it can be to work in children's ministry! Not all children's ministry workers are teachers. We need the whole Body of Christ to get involved in raising up the next generation!



Placing Teachers

We recommend you recruit a whole bunch of helpers for your Vacation Bible School to travel with the children to the different areas. They do not have to prepare a class or teach anything. Their main job will be to learn the names of the children and to help them move around to the different activities. You can even assign small groups of the children of the same age and give each small group a leader. We recommend groups of five to ten children.

The rest of your recruiting is specific to each job: the person who will give the main teaching, the person who will run each station, the actors, the dance team, and each color-team captain.

Since the manual is available online, we recommend you demonstrate to the leaders of each center where to easily look at their instructions on their phones. For example, the snacks leader can find the directions and recipes for the snacks for each day on their cell phone. The game director can locate the game ideas and instructions online. If this is not possible for your group, you may wish to make a copy of their specific page to give them so they can prepare for their part.

A Rotation Vacation Bible School

This Vacation Bible School is written to be used with a rotation schedule with three stations. This means that you break your group up into three groups, and those groups rotate through the three provided stations. Each station lasts thirty minutes, and each station is repeated three times so that each group goes to each station once each day.

You can divide your group up however you want, but we recommend you split them up by ages. This means that each group will NOT be the same size. However, it will make it easier for the staff to do each station for a specific age-group each rotation. You can use whatever age separations you normally use or use what we have set up for our student books.

Our student books for Vacation Bible School are divided into these four age-groups:

"Easy" 4-6 years old "Medium" 7-9 years old "Difficult" 10-12 years old "Advanced" 13-15 years old





Opener

Praise and worship:

Open up your VBS with some fun music with actions. We recommend you prepare a group of young people who can practice ahead of time and learn all the actions to the songs. Have them dress Chor Police style and you will have yourself a really fun kick-off every day. Drama skit:

After the music is finished, the drama/skit follows, creating lots of laughter. You can plan ahead with the three actors who will play the parts of both chors and police and have them practice for each day's drama. Many churches get really involved with the costumes, making the whole Vacation Bible school more fun.

Bible lesson:

After the drama is the main teaching. Your students are still all together in your main room.

Tell the Bible story and the application to this special chor police Vacation Bible school.

Prayer:

The final part of the main lesson is the prayer time. This is done best with some soft music playing in the background. You may want to cover the main theme of the day, asking God's help to make it clear.

That wraps up the opening session. The timing for this opening session could be 12 minutes for music, 8 minutes for the drama, 7 minutes for speaking and 3 minutes for prayer.

When you are finished, play some peppy music as the children move to get into their teams.





Competition can be a really fun part of your Vacation Bible school, but it is totally optional. In order to keep the groups even, divide each age group into four groups. Bandanas are an easy way to show which team each child belongs to. For example, you could have the blue team, red team, yellow team, and green team. Give each team a fun, creative name. Each age group would then have children who were a part of each of the four color teams. Likewise, each of the four teams would have some children from all ages included.

Assign a captain for each team to lead their team time. Each day after the opening session, they can take 5-10 minutes to prepare a "cheer" for their team or a cool march. They can pray together and talk about strategies to win. We recommend that you have these team meetings in your main room, separated into the four corners of the room, allowing each team to hear each other practice. It will create more energy. This time only needs to last 5-10 minutes before blowing a whistle or playing music to tell them to head to their seats.

At the end of the day, have the four team leaders up on stage for the closing ceremony. Allow them to present team cheers then announce which team is ahead in points. Record the points for each team on a big chart.

The easiest area to assign points is the "Chor Police Games." But you can also have teachers take notes of which students are very well behaved, help clean up, are kind to others, or who help the younger students. Children who memorize the verse and can quote it could get points for their team.

Prepare some sort of reward for the team that wins at the end of the week!

Stations rotation can be really fun. Our favorite way is to play music when it is time to rotate, so that there is lots of energy as the students rotate from one station to another.

The recommended time for each station is 30 minutes.

It is easy to separate the children for their station groups by age. Just announce with the microphone the age levels and what station they should start at. Have them start at the same place every day, so that by day two they have it memorized!

Decorate Your Station

Be creative with pictures on the walls of castles, police, or chor items. You could put a paper chor overseeing your game area, and a queen on the wall where snacks are served. The king would fit in with the bible lesson or student book activities area.

Pre-class Preparation

Before children arrive, hang up the voting poster for the day. Prepare a blank sheet of paper and tape to be able to cover the area where each age group voted on their opinion of the Bible story. The goal is to let each group decide for themselves and not be influenced by votes from earlier groups. Have pencils or crayons ready for students to work on their worksheets. Prepare any supplies that will be needed for the memory verse game that you plan to use. It would enhance the fun for the students if you plan for some prizes for winners occasionally.



Class time:

(Might not be first station to go to in your rotation)

First Activity: Voting

When students come in, gather them around the voting charts and introduce the question and the two possible choices. Allow a few minutes of discussion about the Bible story and what it would feel like to be there. Discuss what choices the students would have made. Each child will sign the chart in the section for their age group, selecting what they would have done or what opinion they would have had if they were there when the story happened. (They can also use stickers for voting if you choose.) You can give the finished chart to the Vacation Bible school leader to show the children how everyone voted and which choice won the most votes for the day. This could be a part of the closing group time to reinforce the Bible story and make it personal.

Second Activity

Next, the students will sit down to do their worksheet. There are 4 levels of books, so be sure to give them the right book for their age level. The younger students who cannot read will enjoy the coloring page. The older students will have a lot more fun with the complicated maze and word finds. You can print books for your students, or just photocopy the page for each day and pass out the lesson sheet for each day.

The worksheets for older students have provocative discussion questions.. Be sure to study it before the children arrive and to be open to vibrant discussions while they work on them

Bible Review with clay:

(Might not be first station to go to in your rotation)

This year's main lessons should be loads of fun as the children get their hands goopy with clay! Don't worry about making a mess because keeping things clean isn't the goal. The goal is to change lives. If we just preach a sermon to children, they will not be able to remember the lesson or to apply it at home. But making shapes with clay during the Bible story will help them review and remember the lesson for each day. So get excited about changing some lives and make up a whole bunch of clay!

As you tell the Bible story, they will make shapes with their hands to represent different parts of the story. At the end of each story, you will want to collect all the clay in the same bags as quickly as possible.

We recommend that, once you make several batches of clay, you divide them up into small balls, one for each child. Then put each ball into a plastic bag. This way you will be ready to pass them out quickly and collect them again at the end of each Bible story. Have some napkins and maybe even buckets of water ready where your students can wash their hands if needed. You may want to protect the area with a sheet of paper or plastic so the clay doesn't make the mat or children's clothing dirty. Prepare some ushers ahead of time, or have all your leaders ready to help you collect all the clay.

The directions covering what to make with the clay as you review the Bible lesson are listed in the directions for each day's lesson. Included here are some of our favorite homemade clay recipes. We hope you can have some fun as you change lives for eternity!

Fruity Homemade Clay:

2 ¼ Cups flour

1 Cup salt

2 Tbs of flavored Tang drink mix

4 Tbs oil

1 Cup water

Using powdered drink mix is great for homemade clay because it not only colors the dough, but gives it a wonderful smell too! Mix the flour, salt and drink mix on the stove, then add the water and oil. Continue mixing and gently heating it until it stiffens into a dough. Take it out of the pan and knead it a few minutes!





Easy Homemade Clay:

2 Cups flour 1/2 Cup salt 1 Tbs oil 250 ml (1cup) cold water 7-10 drops food-coloring or Tang (flavored drink mix) Mix together half of the flour, with the salt. In a separate bowl, mix together the water, oil and coloring, then add to the flour mixture. Add the rest of the flour as needed. Turn onto a floured surface and knead till smooth.

This is an easy homemade clay and requires no cooking!



Memory Verse Games (part of clay time)

Learning the Bible verse lasts for a life time. God often brings the verse into a person's memory at an appropriate time to guide and instruct. Turning the job of memorizing into a fun activity makes it enjoyable, quick and easy.

Introduce the game, explaining the rules, how to win, and reminding the students that team points can be earned. Supplies needed and instructions are listed in the daily lesson plan. Play the game repeatedly so many can have a chance to "win." The goal is to have a lot of fun while memorizing the verse. This activity can fill up the remainder of the class time. Have the students leave the class area cleaned up and ready for the next group to arrive.

Crafts Station (Might not be first station to go in your rotation)

Crafts are a fun part of any VBS. We have provided the designs, patterns, list of supplies needed, and instructions for all our crafts online, allowing you to download and prepare your crafts ahead of time for your Vacation Bible School.

Be sure to let the children get messy and to show them lots of love! Parents will love their crafts and they will be a reminder of the theme of each day's Bible lesson, so it doesn't matter if the outcome is perfect or made exactly like your sample.

Snack Time

Each lesson has the recipe and a picture of the suggested snack. You may want to have hand sanitizer available. Plan how you will serve the students and have the snacks prepared and ready to pass out.

Game time

This will be a favorite with games provided each day for lots of fun. Don't forget to keep track of which color bandana or ribbon wins to announce at the closing ceremony of each day. Watch for good sportsmanship and cheering for teams to reward points also. Have fun!

Closing

Invite the four team leaders up on the platform. Allow them to present their team cheers. Announce the points each team won for the day. The students will look forward to learning which team is ahead. Remind everyone there will be an award at the end of the week for the team with the most points.

Lead the entire group of children quoting the bible verse of the day. Give a hint about something fun planned for the next day to make the children not want to miss out. Encourage them to tell their friends about the fun they are having at Vacation Bible School, and to invite them to come tomorrow. Briefly review the main theme of the story and the application. Close in prayer. Fill the extra time, until the parents pick up their children singing the same worship songs you used at the beginning of the day.

Extra bonus ideas



Photo shoots are a fun way to remember the fun and theme of your vacation bible school.

Let's have a photo opportunity for children and parents! You can make this Vacation Bible School a special occasion that they will remember for years.

Decorations



Set the atmosphere of excitement for your Vacation Bible School with a huge decoration made from balloons.

Drama/Skit

Patlu: It looks like some chors.

Motu: Who is it? Who are the idiots?

Patlu: It's us.

Motu: Ha, that's funny! I thought you just said it was us.

Patlu: It is us, Motu

Motu: What! How did he know? I thought we were silent and there was nobody watching. Can the king see everything in the town from his castle up on the big hill? Maybe he was watching us?

Matthew 9:9-13

Main Lesson

You are wanted.

Your name is on the poster, and people are out looking for you.

But why? Because you were caught red handed.

You have been caught in sin. "What?" you may ask.

YES. God can see everything. He knows when you lie to your parents or steal a candy or hide from your teacher at school. God sees everything.

Raise your hand if you believe in the Bible. Wow, that's good!

Now raise your hand if you believe in Jesus. Wow, great!

Did you know that the Bible says that ALL have sinned? That's right. Both you and I have sinned. Also, Jesus said that we all have sinned!

So if you are going to believe the Bible, you have to believe today's key verse, too:

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23

God is perfect. He never does anything wrong. But the Bible says that we fall short all the time.

We all have done many things against God's will.

But that isn't the end of the story. God knows that we are all sinners, but He still wants to talk to us, use us for His glory, and have a friendship with us.

Today's Bible story is about a sinner who Jesus knew had done wrong. Jesus knew he had sinned. But Jesus stopped and talked to him anyway. Jesus called him anyway.

How many of you would like God to stop and talk to you, even though you have done wrong. Great! Me, too!

The Bible says that Jesus was walking along and He saw a tax collector named Matthew.

Back in the day, the tax collectors were known for taking a cut of people's money.

They were basically stealing from the people all the time. It was so bad that people understood the words "tax collector" to automatically mean

"sinner"! Can you imagine your job being identical to "sinner" because so many in your work lied or cheated or stole?

I bet you can imagine a job where people automatically assume you lie or steal because there is probably a profession in your country that is similar. Do you have people in your country who take bribes?

He was walking by and saw Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. Jesus said to Matthew, "Follow me."

Immediately Matthew got up, left his post, and followed Jesus!

Matthew was no longer at his post but left everything to follow Jesus!

Later, Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, and the Bible says that there were many other tax collectors and sinners there to have dinner with them. The religious leaders asked the disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?"

Jesus responded, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick."

Did you know you were sick? I bet you feel just fine!

When Jesus said, "The sick are the ones who need a doctor," He was saying that sinners are the ones who need a Savior. If you think you are perfect and don't need any help, then you are on your own. Jesus came to help those who recognize that they are not perfect and do need the help. You and I are on the wanted poster. We are caught in sin. The Bible says that ALL of us have sinned. But that is not the end of the story! Jesus is still looking for you! He knows that you are a sinner, but He wants a relationship with you anyway. In fact, He came to earth for sinners! How many of you would like to have Jesus as your friend? That's wonderful! Let's pray together.

"Thank you, Jesus for coming to earth for us sinners. I admit to you right now that I am a sinner. I have made mistakes. Thank you for being willing to talk to me and for being my friend. I believe in you. Amen."

Just like today's drama/skit, you and I are also on the wanted poster. But that is not the end of the story. Tomorrow we will see more of the drama and learn more about God.

Voting

Questions and Answers

1. Think about the best people you know of and the worst. If both die in a traffic collision tomorrow, who will wake up in Heaven spending time with Jesus? Why do you think so?

Answer: Nobody, no matter how good they are, can go to Heaven because of their own goodness. (Romans 3:23) God will forgive anyone who believes in Jesus and asks for His forgiveness. (John 1:12) Discuss celebrities and mafia leaders. If you have time, research online some famous people who have done a lot of good works but are not Christians, and perhaps some people who became Christians in jail while serving their sentence. Which of these will get to Heaven?

2. Who took bribes in the bible story today? Was that illegal? Is it illegal today in your country?

Answer: Matthew was a tax collector. They took bribes or collected more than was required so they would have the extra money for themselves. Yes, it was legal, and Rome considered it payment for doing the job of gathering taxes. Discuss the similarities between scams for money, stealing, and selling high priced things on a commission.

3. Like Matthew, what is a despised job in your community? Would Jesus want a person in that line of work to be His disciple and representative if he was here today?

Answer: Each country will have different answers, but answers might include slavery, prostitution, cleaning toilets or sewers, dangerous factory work, etc. Would Jesus want them today? "Yes!!" He chose Matthew deliberately. He still calls people, today, no matter what their job is.

Answers: Circle all except Jesus. Encourage a discussion about the superhero who might be imagined to be sinless since he's not a real person but an imaginary figure. Discuss the fact that Jesus is not imaginary but is real, and His sinlessness is also real. If the superhero was real, he'd sin just like we do even when we do our best to be good all of the time.

In the box on the left are negative actions. In the box on the right there are possible responses and consequences. Write the negative actions that are missing.

Allow the different punishments to open a discussion and make the lesson more interesting and applicable to present-day life for the students. Accept all answers, allowing the students to have fun with the reward and the crime. Some possible answers: Gave the dog some of my chips, woke me up too early, blew my head off, etc. Possible rewards: \$1,000,000, 2 packages of chips, a mommy hug, a free pass to get out of doing chores.

The Bible with Homemade Clay

Let's get out some homemade clay for today's Bible story!

The Bible says that Jesus was walking along and He saw a tax collector named Matthew.

Divide your clay into three balls. With two clay balls, let's make a table and chair for Matthew to work at. (Give the students time to make the table and chair while sharing about tax collectors.)

Back in the day, the tax collectors were known for taking a cut of people's money. Since they were taking people's money for the government, many took a little extra. They were basically stealing from the people all the time. It was so bad that people understood the words "tax collector" to automatically mean "sinner"! Can you imagine your job being identical to "sinner" because so many in your work lied or cheated or stole? Okay, now let's make Matthew out of clay and set him down on the chair. (Give them a little time to finish Matthew.)

Okay. You can smash those, and now let's make a coin box and some coins. I bet you can imagine a job where people automatically assume you lie or steal because there is probably a profession in your country that is similar. Do you have people in your country who take bribes? Do people pay to have someone lie for them? This was the life of Matthew. He was a known sinner. Tax collectors took people's money and put it in a box to turn into the government. Only, they usually didn't turn over all the money.

You can smash the money, and now let's make Jesus with all your clay. He was walking by and saw Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. Jesus said to Matthew, "Follow me."

Immediately Matthew got up, left his post, and followed Jesus!

Now let's make a table and chair again with our clay, only this time, let's leave them empty! Matthew was no longer at his post but left everything to follow Jesus!

Did you know you were sick? I bet you feel just fine!

When Jesus said, "The sick are the ones who need a doctor," He was saying that sinners are the ones who need a Savior. If you think you are perfect and don't need any help, then you are on your own. Main Lesson

You were wanted.

You or your friends might not see your jail cell, but God can. In fact, your friends might be in their own jail cell!

Our key verse from the Bible today is, "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 6:23 Do you remember the lesson from yesterday? We all have sinned, every single one of us!

Well, there is an actual punishment for that sin, just like in today's drama/skit, where Motu and Patlu were caught for their prank and put into jail. Do your parents have punishments at your home? For example, if you don't finish your homework, you don't get to play with your friends. That would be a normal punishment.

Well, God has a punishment, too. It's a punishment for all who have sinned.

But God is also very merciful and doesn't always give us what we deserve.

Well, there is an actual payment that has been made for that sin. It is just like in today's drama/skit, where they were bailed out of jail and received an offer.

Have you ever had to restore a friendship by paying for something you broke or stole? That would be a normal payment to restore the relationship with people whose things we have damaged.

Well, God needs us to make a payment, too. All those who have sinned need to restore their relationship with God.

But God is very loving and has made a way for us to restore our relationship with Him.

Questions and Answers

1. What does it mean to pay the bail? How much bail is required for different crimes?

Bail money is a way to guarantee that a charged person will appear in court and not run away and hide to avoid being found guilty. Each country will vary. In the USA each state sets guidelines with a minimum and a maximum. It often is 10% to 20% of the damages. It can be very high (or denied) if the defendant is shown to be a risk for not appearing at the court date. Matthew 18:25-34

2. What did Jesus have to pay? Why did he have to pay? What was His crime?

Jesus paid for sins that we commit by death on a cross. The reason he had to pay was God planned it to redeem all people who believe in him and accept Jesus as their Savior. He did not commit any crimes so he was like the sacrifice from the laws in the old testament that required the lamb that they sacrificed was faultless and perfect.

3. Are innocent people ever found guilty and put into prison or sentenced to death today?

Sadly, yes it happens sometimes. There have been instances where a person was killed because they refused to deny Christ.Matthew 10:33 "But whoever disowns me before others, I will disown before my Father in heaven." These martyrs chose to admit to being Christian rather than deny Christ and not be killed. However: Hebrews 11:37 shows it is not new.

Patlu: That is it! It is like they have been branded, trademarked with the "Certification Mark".. Everybody who has accepted the king's offer are not running or hiding.

Motu: Then we are like that! Maybe I should stick you with this. [Waving the can of glue at Patlu.]

Patlu: We sure are. Put that thing down before you hurt yourself. Let's get this job done so we can go to town using the main street.

Motu: Main Street? We haven't walked down Main Street in years.

Patlu: What gets the first trademark?



Main Lesson

You were wanted. You were caught and thrown into jail.

But then you were BAILED out!

And today we are learning about marking what we own.

Ranchers mark their livestock with a brand so that if one wanders off and somebody finds it, it will be easy to tell who owns each animal. You can't ask a dog or lost bike to tell you where it lives when it gets lost, like a policeman can ask a lost child where he lives. The Bible says that you were bought with a price (1 Cor. 6:20).

How much did you cost?

Remember in the lesson yesterday, that Jesus paid the price for our sins when He died on the cross. Then that is what you and I cost! Jesus' death was very painful. It wasn't a cheap price that He paid to redeem you.

What valuable thing has your family paid for? Perhaps a bicycle or car? Is it marked so that it can be examined and found to belong to your family? Yes. Every car has a special number marked on it that is registered to the owner. Sometimes people mark their bike with their name or a number. That way, if it is stolen, they can notify the authorities to help catch the thief.

These are examples of branding!

Do you remember in the Bible story on Tuesday? There was a crowd of people following Jesus and listening to everything He said. Yesterday we heard that there was also a huge crowd of people watching to see what would happen to Jesus when He was accused. Do you know what? There was always a crowd of people around Jesus. His name is Zacchaeus, but we'll call him Zack. He lived in Jericho. Yes, that's the same city you heard about that Joshua marched around and whose walls God made fall down. Jesus came into the city of Jericho and was going to pass through it when Zack heard about Him. Boy, did he want to see and hear Jesus! Wouldn't you?

Like you, Zack wasn't very tall so he had a problem. How could he see what Jesus looked like? How could he hear what Jesus said? There was a huge crowd of people surrounding Jesus all of the time. It was like going to see a big parade and getting there late. Wouldn't it be great if you could watch out of a second-story window above the street? Behind rows and rows of people, you can't see much of anything! Zack ran ahead along the road that Jesus would be coming down and spotted a tree and climbed up to get a much better view.

When Jesus got to the tree, He stopped and looked up and said to the little man, "Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today." Zack was very happy to welcome Jesus to his home.

In fact, he repented of his sins right there! He said to Jesus, "Look Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount."

He hadn't been physically branded, but people could really see the difference. It was just like in the drama/skit, when Motu and Patlu could really see something different in others.

When you accept Jesus to pay for you and your sins, you become His. He will give you the Holy Spirit as proof that you belong to Him. The Holy Spirit will convict you of sin and help you to say you are sorry and to admit it when you do bad things. He will help you to live close to God and to grow as a Christian.

Questions and Answers

1. Can you be good enough to be saved and get to go to heaven? What does it take?

None are righteous. (Romans 3:23) Nobody is good enough. (Romans 10:9) It takes believing and declaring your belief with your mouth.

2. Have you ever been too short to see something you wanted to see? When and where?

Possible experiences include: sports games when standing on the sidelines with people in front of you, parades, displays in stores etc. That's the reason bleachers are often constructed so more people can get high enough to see well, like Zacchaeus wanted. Help the students relate to Zacchaeus and understand what he was thinking and feeling.

3. Imagine Jesus said he is coming to your house today, what are your thoughts and worries? Do you think he says that to people today? Is going to church like going to visit His house? Can one meet Jesus there? Would the outcome have been different if Zacchaeus had not gone to see Jesus? Teachers, accept all answers and encourage students to be genuine not pretending to be super spiritual. Example: What can I wear? Will my little brother have toys everywhere and make too much noise? What can we cook that he'd like?

Bible Review with Homemade Clay

Let's get out the clay for today's Bible story.

First make a cow with your clay and mark it with your fingernail on its rump (just like a brand). With that brand, it is plain the cow belongs to you! Do you remember in the Bible story on Tuesday? There was a crowd of people following Jesus and listening to everything He said. Yesterday we heard that there was also a huge crowd of people watching to see what would happen to Jesus when He was accused. Do you know what? There was always a crowd of people around Jesus. Now, make a little man with your play dough. His name is Zacchaeus, but we'll call him Zack. He lived in Jericho. Yes, that's the same city you heard about that Joshua marched around and whose walls God made fall down. Jesus came into the city of Jericho and was going to pass through it when Zack heard about Him. Boy, did he want to see and hear Jesus! Wouldn't you? Now form a big tree with your clay but leave a little bit of clay separate.

Like you, Zack wasn't very tall so he had a problem. How could he see what Jesus looked like? How could he hear what Jesus said? There was a huge crowd of people surrounding Jesus all of the time. It was like going to see a big parade and getting there late. Wouldn't it be great if you could watch out of a second-story window above the street? Behind rows and rows of people, you can't see much of anything! Zack ran ahead along the road that Jesus would be coming down and spotted a tree and climbed up to get a much better view.

(Make a ball with the bit of clay and form it into a head that you can put into your tree. Let Zack peek out from the branches and watch Jesus.) When Jesus got to the tree, He stopped and looked up and said to the little man, "Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today." Now put a big smile on Zack and take him out of that tree. Zack was very happy to welcome Jesus to his home.

In fact, he repented of his sins right there! He said to Jesus, "Look Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount."

Use your clay and make one of your most treasured possessions. Imagine giving somebody four of them! That had to hurt! Zack was wealthy, so when he said he'd give away half of everything he owned to poor people, he wasn't talking about a small amount.

The people were outside of his house whispering and gossiping about Jesus visiting him. He was a sinner, a bad man, a cheater and a tax collector. Zack was a completely-changed man because of his visit with Jesus.

Make Zack with your clay and put a happy face on him. Why did Jesus pick him, even when he was a little hidden by the branches of a tree? Jesus told him, "The son of man came to seek and save the lost." Jesus explained that He wants to save everybody who knows they are lost and need saving. Zack accepted Jesus that day. His sudden generosity was proof that he had completely changed. It was like a brand on a cow; it showed that now he belonged to God. He hadn't been physically branded, but people could really see the difference. It was just like in the drama/skit, when Motu and Patlu could really see something different in others.

When you accept Jesus to pay for you and your sins, you become His. He will give you the Holy Spirit as proof that you belong to Him. The Holy Spirit will convict you of sin and help you to say you are sorry and to admit it when you do bad things. He will help you to live close to God and to grow as a Christian.

Now, make yourself with your clay.

We prayed today, and if you chose to become a follower of Jesus like Zack in the story today, you can put a cross "brand" on your play dough self to show that you belong to God.

(Collect the clay from the students.)



Game Memory Verse Time

Have the children sit in a circle on the floor. Write the verse on the board or on a piece of paper where the children can see it. Then have the children pass a Police star or handcuffs to the child next to them. Whoever is holding the star or cuffs says the next word of the verse. To make things more difficult, allow the students to toss the star or cuffs across the circle to any child to say the next word of the verse.

Snack Fruit Kebabs

Ingredients:

- 2 oranges
- 2 bananas
- 1 bowl grapes
- 1 small papaya cut into small chunks
- 1 small water melon cut into small chunks
- Toothpicks
- Chaat masala 2 tbsp

(Note: Above is the suggestion of fruits to be used but you can replace the fruits with locally available fruits of your choice. Just keep in mind to use two to three different colours of fruits. Provide more fruit if you are serving a large group.)

Instructions:

1.Peel and cut all fruits into small chunks and keep in separate bowls

2. Give tooth picks to each child and allow them to make their own kebabs, sprinkle with chaat masala and enjoy your own fruit kebabs.

Crafts Binoculars

Materials:

- -Printed copy of the tubes for each lens
- -Scissors
- -Colored pens, crayons, or colored pencils
- -Glue
- -Curli ribbon
- -Paper Punch

Instructions:

- Step 1. Color the binoculars and the two paper strips, decorate to your liking.
- Step 2. Cut out the binoculars and strips along the dotted lines
- Step 3. Roll the two binocular tubes and glue the tabs to secure
- Step 4. Fold the small strips into zigzags. (Back and forth 3 times)

Step 5. Attach the strips to the sides of the tubes with glue as shown, so you can join and separate the tubes to fit the binoculars to your eyes.

Step 6. Punch a hole in the tube, where the paper overlaps (strongest place) Tie the curly ribbon to the outside of each tube so the binoculars can be worn around a student's neck

Main Lesson

You were wanted. You were put into jail. You were bailed out. You were branded.

Today we are talking about being deputized! That's right; Jesus has a job for you! "But, I'm not ready for this," you say? Well, Jesus has chosen to use you. There are many people who need to hear that Jesus is asking them to follow Him, too.

You probably have friends who believe that they have to be good enough for God. But that is not true. Do you remember the lesson? Jesus died for the sick, not the healthy. So as long as we think we are healthy and are trying to be good enough in our own strength, we are missing the whole point!

God doesn't want us to be good enough. He wants us to accept that we are sinners and to allow Jesus to pay the price for our sins.

Our key verse from the Bible today is, "And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?" Romans 10:14b

So the question for you is this: how can your friends hear about Jesus unless you tell them?

Have you ever had some good news you wanted to share with someone? You couldn't wait to let them know what had happened. Well, God has given us some great news. We do not have to pay for our own sins; Jesus has offered to do that. So, how will your friends hear if you don't tell them?

One day, Jesus was standing by the Sea of Galilee, and a crowd was forming around Him to listen to the Word of God. As the crowd grew, Jesus wanted to make sure everyone could hear. He climbed into Peter's boat and pushed it out a little. Then he sat down and taught them from the boat.

When Jesus was done sharing with the people, He asked Peter to climb in and go fishing with Him. Peter had worked all night but climbed in the boat to fish, anyway. When the fishermen (including Peter) let down their nets, they were filled to the maximum and the nets started to break! Peter, James and John were amazed at their catch. 3. Romans 5:8 "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

4. Romans 10:9 "If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."

5. Romans 10:14b "...And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?"

Voting

Questions and Answers

1. What did Jesus mean when he told Peter, "From now on, you will fish for people."?

Answer: He told Peter his job was going to change and from now on; he wouldn't be working on a boat. Jesus wanted him to go and tell everyone about Jesus. When someone believed him about Jesus, it was going to be as great as catching a huge amount fish.

2. Describe what Jesus wants us to do after we believe in Him?

Answer: "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations"" teaching them to observe all that I commanded you," (Matthew 28:19, 20) He wants all of us to tell others what we believe about Jesus and about what he has done.

3. If a friend listens to you and believes what you are telling them about Jesus, what do you do next?

Answer: Ask your friend to pray with you to accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior and forgive their sins. Teachers, if you have time, practice with the kids a simple salvation prayer and lead them to practice with each other.

Crafts Royal Crown

Materials:

Day 1 Game Time

Tip Toe Water Bottle Walk

You will need:

- \cdot 6 plastic water bottles filled with water
- \cdot Cloth to blind fold
- · Washable marker or chalk

Instructions

1. Mark a straight line and start and end point using washable marker or chalk on the floor.

2. Place filled water bottles on the line.

3. Tie a cloth over one child's eyes.

4. Each blind folded child needs to tip toe walk in the straight line from start to finish without knocking the bottles.

5. If the child knocks the bottle he is out of the game.

6. The child who finishes without knocking the bottles is the winner.



This will be a favorite station with games provided each day for lots of fun. Don't forget to keep track of which color bandana or ribbon wins during each rotation to announce at the closing ceremony of each day. Have fun!



Day 2 Game Time

Wheel Barrow Race

Divide the children into their color teams and have them pick a partner. Have one child lie on the ground on their stomach while the other child grabs their ankles and lifts their legs in the air. (This is the wheel barrow position.) The pairs of children race one another to the finish line.

Supplies for day 2

- String, tape, or lines in the dirt to mark the start and finish lines
- Bananas

Inside or Outside Banana Olympics (Relay Race)

Divide your class into their color teams. Give each team a banana. Using the ideas below choose one of the races or use them all.

1. Place the banana between the knees and hop to the finish line and back.

Two teammates toss the banana back and forth down to the finish line and back.
Children put the banana under their armpit and hop on one leg down and back, one person at a time.

4. Each player has a banana tied to a string that is tied around their waist. Use the banana to roll a ball to the finish line.

Day 3 Game Time

Tug o' War

You need a thick rope for this game with a large knot tied in each end. The rope needs to be thick enough that it will not burn the children's hands. Divide the children into their color teams. Have one team line up and grab one end of the rope; have another team do the same on the other end. Mark the middle of the rope with a line in the dirt. The children pull the rope as a team and try to pull the other team over the middle line. Repeat the tug o' war game with the other two teams. Then have the two winning teams compete against each other.

Supplies for day 3

- Balloons
- Tape
- Sharp pin
- Thick rope
- String or a line in the dirt marking the middle, finish lines, or starting ling
- Long rag to tie legs together

Three-Legged Race

Have the children divide into their color teams and pick a partner. The partners stand side by side. Using a long rag, tie their touching legs together. They have to run on their "three" legs to the finish line. Whichever team gets there first wins!



Day 4 Game Time

Place the character in the castle game

You can make 2 or more teams. Make a big drawing of a castle on a sheet of paper and draw a big door in the middle, also draw the king or some character from Chor Police and cut it out. Line up the kids. During each child's turn, blindfold them, tape the chor police character on the back, and spin the child in a circle. Then point him in the direction of the castle gate and ask him to put the character in the gate. The one inside the door wins. Alternatively, team members could direct the blindfolded child with cues, "up, down, left, right, perfect!"



Supplies for day 4

- Large drawn or painted paper castle
- Printed paper Chief Inspector and chors
- Blindfolds
- Tape

Day 5 Game Time

Nondi/Stapoo/Hopscotch

Divide the children into color teams and line them up. The game involves drawing a grid on the ground and numbering it. Make the squares equal to the words in the memory verse. Players take turns and throw an object, usually a small stone, onto the numbered blocks. They have to hop across the blocks to pick up the object jumping on one/two legs to finish the lap, taking care not to step on the border lines. They must say the words of the verse for each hop. Keep going until one team has quoted the verse for each member hopping.

Catch the Chor

Divide your group into color teams. For each team you will need two brooms or water noodles and six balloons, three of one color and three of another. Set two chairs at the other end of the room/hall. Each team member has to use the broom to chase the "balloon Chor" to the other end of the room, around a chair and back to the next team member. Have a few spare balloons handy in case some pop!

Supplies for day 5

- Chalk, small stone
- String, chairs, or a line in the dirt to mark the start and finish lines
- Balloons of two colors
- Four brooms or water noodles (poles with soft ends in case of whacks)



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Extra Games



Balloon Stomp

Tie a balloon on the ankle of each child. Their goal is to try to pop the other children's balloons without getting their own balloon popped. The winner is the person who still has a balloon tied to his/her foot.

Sack Race

If you can find big sacks (like flour sacks, potato sacks, gunny sacks, etc.), a sack race is lots of fun.

Balloon Stampede

Fill your play area with balloons. Then set the children loose on a balloon-popping stampede. Fill the balloons with prizes such as star stickers and temporary tattoos prior to inflating. Once the stampede is over, kids can go back and collect the prizes.





Police Hat in the Ring Toss

Place a hula hoop on the ground. Children line up behind a line and try to toss their hats into the ring. (Or have a few hand cuffs available for the game.) Award a prize to players who land their police hats inside the hula hoop. You can also draw a large bull's-eye target on the lawn and have the player whose hat lands closest to the bull's-eye win the game.
